From Father's Desk

Rejoice! It's Gaudete Sunday. Marking the halfway point, this day every year marks that Christmas is quickly – too quickly – approaching. Every year it gets to be around December 15 and I wonder where all the time has gone and how in the world can Christmas only be 10 days away.

This weekend all three of our parishes have the Christmas programs. It's great to see the kids put this together. Some of them might like the spotlight, as it were, and some of them might have to overcome some fear. Likely all of them have some nerves. Nevertheless, it's good to work with others in this way. And most importantly, even if simple, to honor our Lord and the gift that is His Advent into the world.

I want to thank our Faith Formation Coordinators, especially, as well as our catechists and other volunteers who put the Christmas programs together. But also for all their work throughout the year with our Faith Formation programs. This is some of the most important work a parish does – hand on the teachings of our faith to the next generation so that they can know how Jesus wants to save us and bring us closer to Himself. Thank you!

There are several opportunities for Confession, yet, before Christmas. The saints have long given the example of making a regular Confession. Oftentimes, many Catholics throughout the world keep their faith alive by making a monthly Confession around First Friday and First Saturday. The precepts of the Church require only an annual Confession, but the precepts are “meant to guarantee to the faithful the very necessary minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor” (CCC 2041).

Encouraging not only the minimum but a little more is why it is such a widespread practice to have ample opportunity and really encourage going to Confession twice a year, during Advent and during Lent – the two seasons of penance in the liturgical year. Please find time to make a good confession, yet. It's one of the most important ways of preparing for Christmas.

This past week saw two feast days that are closely related. First, on December 9 is the optional memorial of Saint Juan Diego, the young peasant who became a great witness to the faith by encountering the Blessed Virgin Mary. And that encounter is commemorated on December 12 in the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe, when Mary revealed herself and won over the hearts of the Mexican people by showing herself to be the Mother of God and the ambassador for life and the dignity of life.
