From Father's Desk

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. The Church puts this feast on the Sunday after Christmas as a way of fleshing out more fully the reality of the Nativity, that the Christ child was born into a human family. As the vulnerable little one, He is in need of a dad and mom like all of us, and the saintly Joseph and Mary are that for Him. Joseph by faith. Mary by blood and faith.

On the octave (eighth) day of Christmas, we celebrate Mary herself, in a special way, under the title and patronage of the Mother of God. This is a celebration of Her as the mother of the Holy Family, but also as the mother of the very Son of God.

Some in the early Church doubted that we could call Mary "Mother of God" because they thought that made the human part of Jesus too close to the Divine Godhead. They thought she could only be considered the mother of the human nature. The rest of the early Church fathers rightly pointed out: but the human nature is God, the whole Person of Jesus is the bridge of God and Man in one. And since she's the Mother of the Jesus as human, she must also be the Mother of God. If we were to deny this, we would separate Jesus from Himself, and we would deny the whole reason for the Incarnation: that God Himself has lived among us.

The Church also dedicates the whole year to the Mother of God by celebrating this feast on January 1, asking Blessed Mary to pray for us and watch over us throughout the whole next year. Because of this, it is a Holy day of Obligation in the United States. We will have Mass at each parish, and those times are on the front page.

On January 2nd, the Church celebrates some important Church Fathers (bishops in the early church). St. Basil the Great and St. Gregory Nazianzen are commemorated on this day. They were very influential as the "Cappadocian Fathers" (along with St. Basil's brother, St. Gregory of Nyssa), living in that area, which is nowadays Turkey. They were influential in defending the truth of Jesus' two natures in One Person, as well as the Divine Personhood of the Holy Spirit. This set the foundation for later teachings on Mary's recognition as the Mother of God.

Lastly, as we have done in previous years, St. Finbarr in Grand Meadow will not have daily Mass from the beginning of the year until Lent begins. The Tuesday Mass will be moved to Spring Valley at St. Ignatius for those approximately six weeks. When we resume in Lent, the Mass will return to St. Finbarr in the evening, together with the Stations of the Cross.
