From Father's Desk

Bishop Barron celebrates the Diocese of Winona-Rochester Mass for Life today. We thank His Excellency for coming to St. Finbarr and celebrating Mass here. We also resolve to pray and work for a culture of life.

The unrest in the Twin Cities is not good. Bishop Barron made a statement which we can all heed:

“As a resident of Minnesota and as bishop of the Diocese of Winona-Rochester, my heart is breaking over the situation in my home state. Violence, retribution, threats, protests, deep suspicion of one another, political unrest, fear—all of it swirling around all the time. May I make a modest proposal for exiting this unbearable state of affairs? The Trump Administration and ICE should limit themselves, at least for the time being, to rounding up undocumented people who have committed serious crimes. Political leaders should stop stirring up resentment against officers who are endeavoring to enforce the laws of the country. And protestors should cease interfering with the work of ICE. And everyone on all sides must stop shouting at one another and demonizing their opponents. Where we are now is untenable. There is a way out.”

My trip to Japan to visit Fr. Adam McMillan, my Navy Chaplain priest friend, a priest of our diocese, went well. The flights both went well—half empty on the way over and packed full on the way back. I didn't have any jet lag while in Japan. That was a great blessing.

I have had some okay sushi once or twice here in the States in years past, but the sushi was very good in Japan. There was a nice dinner which we went to with some of his parishioners from the base in Yokosuka. Three or four of those dishes did not taste good, in my opinion. Other people loved them. Overall, it was very good.

Fr. Adam and I visited Kyoto, took in the sights, visited some gardens there (not the best season for it, but still beautiful), and toured the grounds around the former Imperial Palace, including touring the old Shogun palace that is on the grounds. Lots of history, there, as well as carp in the motel! We also visited Tokyo before the flight home. We walked the Shibuya Crossing. It's like Times Square in New York, but busier. Look it up on YouTube, it was quite the sight.

I probably most enjoyed seeing his work. His family catechesis on Wednesday evening with a meal and his talk was well attended. I celebrated a daily Mass and a Sunday Mass with the people—he preached the Sunday one. The devotion of the boys serving at the altar and the girls serving as sacristans and gift bearers was inspiring.

I appreciate the trip, but am glad to be home in America.
