From Father's Desk

Merry Christmas!

The Church's season of Christmas is still ongoing and will continue through next Sunday with the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The Church encourages us to continue treasuring the gift of the Lord's birth among us. This continues through next weekend, but in a way also all the way through the 40th day of Christmas with the feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd. I encourage again this year to continue to keep up a Nativity scene or (if you can) your Christmas tree even until then.

I know our American culture celebrates these somewhat in reverse, celebrating nearly for 40 days *before* Jesus' birthday and then nearly immediately the day after thinks, "Well, Christmas is over!" The Church's logic is just the reverse. We need serious preparation beforehand to make room in our hearts to receive the gift of the God-man as a simple little child. We need that time to humble ourselves so that we can properly receive Him who teaches us true humility. And then we celebrate the great fact of His birth for a good long time, striving to sincerely cherish Him. I will continue to listen to Christmas music for as long as I can bear it as February 2nd approaches.

I want to thank everyone, again, who has helped in any way with our Advent and Christmas celebrations. It takes a lot of people to keep a parish running and active, so the contribution of everyone is needed. In a particular way, however, I would like to thank Pat Utz, our organist/pianist/accompanist. For most of the winter, she plays at all three parishes and covers the Masses. That takes a lot of energy and time, and she puts it in gladly. In Spring Valley, we are also blessed to have the Mettler children helping out from time to time. But most often, Pat is coming to all three weekend Masses, driving between the parishes. Pat is listening to my homily three times (how boring!). And Pat does a great job. So thank you, Pat, for all you do for our cluster of parishes.

This week the Church celebrates the memorial of St. John Neumann. Born in Bohemia on March 28, 1811, he was distinguished for his grasp of grammar and philosophy. He entered the seminary in Bohemia, but soon felt a desire to missionary work, inspired by St. Paul's example. He immigrated to the United States in May of 1836 arriving in New York. The bishop was in such great need of German-speaking priests, that in June of that year, St. Neumann was ordained a subdeacon on June 19, a deacon on June 24, and a priest on June 25. His first Mass was the next day on Sunday, June 26, 1836. St. Neumann eventually became the bishop of Philadelphia and founded the first diocesan Catholic school system in the country.
