

#### From Father's Desk -

Today is the St. Ignatius Fall Dinner & Raffle! Come by and enjoy some chicken and purchase a raffle ticket—if there are any left! I hear they're selling fast. It's always great when people from all three parishes show up to support each other's parish at these events. It's a good time seeing everyone and we see how the community comes together. In just over a month, St. Patrick will have a Fall Dinner at the beginning of November, and we look forward to that as well.

In a week's time, from September 29 to October 2, Bishop Barron and the priests of our diocese will be away on our annual convocation, Presbyteral Days. Sometimes people have asked about that, wondering when our "retreat" is, and I find it always a little jarring—because it's very little like my typical retreats! In the business world, yes, it would probably be called a retreat, in the sense of getting away from the office and everyone going to have some experience or have some conferences and whatnot. However, in the Catholic world, a retreat is specifically a dedicated time set aside for prayer and spiritual direction *without* work. At Presbyteral Days, we have presentations on a topic (how to preach better, how to be a better administrator, having a healthier living style, having synods on synodality with synodal discussion for the synodal church, etc.) and a celebration of priest anniversaries. Of course, we also set aside time for the Liturgy of the Hours, daily Mass, and adoration. There's also time built in for recreation (which for many means golf!).

A retreat in the Catholic sense is spending time away with Mass, adoration, prayer, Confession if possible, and perhaps conferences on the spiritual life, and maybe even individual spiritual direction. It is typically a time to set aside all your devices. It's time to set aside work and generally to disconnect from all the rest of life. There are lots of different ways of having a retreat, but there are three more common types. A preached retreat is distinguished by a retreat director giving talks on some topic related to prayer, discernment or the spiritual life. A directed retreat emphasizes one on one meetings with a director who discusses your own life and prayer. A silent retreat prioritizes interior silence, not having casual conversations, minimizing external distractions and, often, is taken alone. These can overlap, of course. In fact, the Church requires a retreat before being ordained a deacon or a priest. The one I did before priesthood was a silent, preached and directed retreat for my class, with one hour of individual direction each day, two conferences a day, and four hours of prayer in the chapel each day, as well as Mass in common, the Liturgy of the Hours and the Rosary privately, and walks on my own. It didn't hurt that it was in Assisi!

This year's priestly convocation at Presbyteral Days is going to be on the Mass. Bishop Barron has also stated that he plans to discuss the Diocesan Synod with us, as well.



#### Sacraments

<u>Baptismr.</u> Arrangements for infant baptism are made at least one month in advance. A one-hour Pre-Jordan session is required for parents who have not participated in one previously. Baptism is preferably celebrated during the Mass on Saturday or Sunday. To make arrangements, contact Fr. Parrott.

<u>Marriage</u>: Arrangements for marriage should begin six months prior to the intended date of the wedding. Marriage preparation requires a series of meetings and a marriage encounter weekend. This sacrament is not celebrated during Lent or Holy Week.

<u>Confession</u>. This is offered before the Saturday Mass from 4:15 – 4:45 p.m., before or after daily Mass in the respective parishes or by appointment with Fr. Parrott or Fr. Collins (LeRoy, 507-289-7637).
