January 26, 2025 Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Readings: Nehemiah 8:2-4a; 1 Corinthians 12:12-30; Luke 1:1-4, 4:14-21

From Father's Desk -

Next Sunday is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord when we celebrate Candlemas. As I mentioned last week, we'll start Mass with the blessing of candles, as well as the ritual procession holding candles. Feel free to bring candles of your own (label them!) and place them with the other candles on the table to be blessed. The church invites us to meditate on Christ, the light of the world, whose warming rays shine upon the cold, arid desert of this world to give warmth to all of our hearts. In this way, we close out the traditional Christmas season and take down our Christmas trees and Nativity scenes.

Traditionally, it was only within a week or two, then, that the church began focusing on the penitential season in preparation for Easter. Though Lent doesn't begin until Ash Wednesday—which this year falls very late on March 5—the church historically began a season of smaller penance two and a half weeks before Ash Wednesday. This season was called Septuagesima, indicating something like 70 days before Easter in which the church offers penance, even though the number is closer to 60. Three Sundays before Ash Wednesday was called Septuagesima Sunday. The second Sunday before Ash Wednesday was called Sexagesima Sunday. The Sunday before Ash Wednesday was called Quinquagesima Sunday. Still to this day, in Latin, Lent is called Quadragesima, for the 40 days of penance before the Sacred Triduum starts on Holy Thursday. (And yes, there is one right way to count to 40 for the season of Lent, and how to correctly and precisely count the 40 days, but that can wait for later.)

"Lent" is a word that we use in English for the season of penance before Easter, but it's pretty much the only language which does that. Other languages follow the official Latin title of calling it "The 40", Quadragesima. In Italian, it's called "La Quaresima." In Spanish, it's called "La Cuaresma". In French, it's called "Le Carême". More Eastern countries follow the Orthodox custom of referring to the penitential fast and call it "The Great Fast,", e.g. in Polish it's "Wielki Post". The English "Lent" comes not from any liturgical reference but from the seasonal reference to Spring. In older English, Spring is "lencten", which has the same root as "lengthen". That is, the days are getting longer.

But all of that is still weeks away. For now, bear with the short, cold, windy days of winter. Let the light and warmth of the Christ child warm your hearts. If you haven't been, an excellent way to stay close to Jesus is with the help of His mother Mary, by praying the Rosary. Don't forget to look up and listen to the Rosary in a Year podcast. If you aren't in the practice of saying a daily Rosary, this podcast will be a great help to growing in prayer with Mary and Jesus.

Sacraments

<u>Baptism</u>. Arrangements for infant baptism are made at least one month in advance. A one-hour Pre-Jordan session is required for parents who have not participated in one previously. Baptism is preferably celebrated during the Mass on Saturday or Sunday. To make arrangements, contact Fr. Parrott.

<u>Marriage</u>: Arrangements for marriage should begin six months prior to the intended date of the wedding. Marriage preparation requires a series of meetings and a marriage encounter weekend. This sacrament is not celebrated during Lent or Holy Week.

<u>Confession</u>. This is offered before the Saturday Mass from 4:15 – 4:45 p.m., before or after daily Mass in the respective parishes or by appointment with Fr. Parrott or Fr. Collins (LeRoy, 507-289-7637).
