February 26, 2025 Feast of the Presentation of the Lord Readings: Malachi 3:1-4; Hebrews 2:14-18; Luke 2:22-40

From Father's Desk -

The Church gives us the ritual of the blessing of candles and the procession with the candles at the beginning of this weekend's Masses for the Feast of the Presentation. Hopefully you can use this to deepen the sense of Christ's presence in your life and our responsibility to carry His light to the world. If you've never experienced it before, treasure it.

With the candles that were blessed, the Church also invites us all to experience an extra grace from God with the blessing of throats the day after Candlemas on the feast day of St. Blaise. I will have daily Mass at St. Ignatius tomorrow, on Monday, and offer the blessing of throats after Mass. As is the custom, two blessed candles are used in this blessing. If you are able to come, please do! It's a unique blessing. The prayer said is: "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness, in the name of the Father..."

During this Jubilee Year, I will try to remember periodically throughout the year (though I very well might forget) to mention the jubilee and, here in these columns, write about it! In his papal bull inaugurating the year, Pope Francis recalled some of the history of jubilee years:

"This interplay of hope and patience makes us see clearly that the Christian life is a *journey* calling for *moments of greater intensity* to encourage and sustain hope as the constant companion that guides our steps towards the goal of our encounter with the Lord Jesus. I like to think that the proclamation of the first Jubilee, in the year 1300, was preceded by a journey of grace inspired by popular spirituality. How can we fail to recall the various ways by which the grace of forgiveness had been poured out upon God's holy and faithful People? We are reminded, for example, of the great 'Pardon' that Saint Celestine V granted to all those who visited the Basilica of Santa Maria di Collemaggio in Aquila on the 28th and 29th days of August 1294, six years before Pope Boniface VIII instituted the Holy Year. The Church was already experiencing the grace of the Jubilee as an outpouring of divine mercy. Even earlier, in 1216, Pope Honorius III granted the plea of Saint Francis for an indulgence for all those visiting the Portiuncola on the first two days of August. The same can be said of the pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela: in 1222, Pope Callistus II allowed the Jubilee to be celebrated there whenever the Feast of the Apostle James fell on a Sunday. It is good that such 'dispersed' celebrations of the Jubilee continue, so that the power of God's forgiveness can support and accompany communities and individuals on their pilgrim way."

Sacraments

<u>Baptism</u>. Arrangements for infant baptism are made at least one month in advance. A one-hour Pre-Jordan session is required for parents who have not participated in one previously. Baptism is preferably celebrated during the Mass on Saturday or Sunday. To make arrangements, contact Fr. Parrott.

<u>Marriage</u>: Arrangements for marriage should begin six months prior to the intended date of the wedding. Marriage preparation requires a series of meetings and a marriage encounter weekend. This sacrament is not celebrated during Lent or Holy Week.

<u>Confession</u>. This is offered before the Saturday Mass from 4:15 – 4:45 p.m., before or after daily Mass in the respective parishes or by appointment with Fr. Parrott or Fr. Collins (LeRoy, 507-289-7637).
