March 16, 2025 Second Sunday of Lent Readings: Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18; Philippians 3:17-4:1; Luke 9:28b-36

From Father's Desk -

Our Lenten season is in full swing, with Stations of the Cross, fish fries and all. There will be several opportunities for Confession this Lent, as well. As the end of Lent gets closer, we'll publish a schedule with those times. In two weeks, however, on Sunday, March 30, at 5:00 pm in Grand Meadow, we will have a penance service with three extra priests helping. Whenever you find time, whether at this service or later in Lent, just ensure you find an opportunity to make a good confession before Easter. It's a beautiful sacrament with healing and grace for all who approach with sincerity.

Today is the St. Patrick Irish Festival and I hope many are able to enjoy the activities. Though he is very popular, sometimes St. Patrick's life isn't very well known. He was born to rather noble parents, sometime around the year 400, perhaps as early as 387. We don't know with certainty where he was born–Scotland, England or even perhaps Wales, but not Ireland. When he was 16 years old, he was taken by Irish pirates and forced into slavery in Ireland.

It was during his six years of slavery when he tended flocks of sheep that St. Patrick really came to have faith. In his *Confession*, he says: "His fear increased in me more and more, and the faith grew in me, and the spirit was roused, so that, in a single day, I have said as many as a hundred prayers, and in the night nearly the same, so that while in the woods and on the mountain, even before the dawn, I was roused to prayer." Escaping from slavery, he traveled some 200 miles by foot, then making his way onto a ship which sailed to Britain. His fervor for the love of God had grown so much he wanted to become a priest and a missionary.

After many years working with St. Germain to evangelize the people of England, St. Germaine sent him to Rome to be evaluated by the pope for the Irish mission. St. Patrick was appointed the missionary to evangelize Ireland (after another who was appointed refused for fear of the task). He was ordained a bishop shortly after receiving this commission from the pope. He returned for a visit to St. Germain and then made his way to Ireland, probably in 433. Though he was first attacked when he landed, he set out for where he had been a slave. There, the Catholic Encyclopedia tells us, St. Patrick paid "the price of ransom to his former master, and in exchange for the servitude and cruelty endured at his hands to impart to him the blessings and freedom of God's children."

From there he continued his ministry with the stories we are more familiar with—preaching about the Trinity using the three-leaf clover, etc. St. Patrick defeated paganism in Ireland by his good example and preaching. Having completed his mission, either in 460, 461, or perhaps even 493, St. Patrick went home to the Lord on March 17.

Sacraments

<u>Baptism</u>. Arrangements for infant baptism are made at least one month in advance. A one-hour Pre-Jordan session is required for parents who have not participated in one previously. Baptism is preferably celebrated during the Mass on Saturday or Sunday. To make arrangements, contact Fr. Parrott.

<u>Marriage</u>: Arrangements for marriage should begin six months prior to the intended date of the wedding. Marriage preparation requires a series of meetings and a marriage encounter weekend. This sacrament is not celebrated during Lent or Holy Week.

<u>Confession</u>. This is offered before the Saturday Mass from 4:15 – 4:45 p.m., before or after daily Mass in the respective parishes or by appointment with Fr. Parrott or Fr. Collins (LeRoy, 507-289-7637).
