March 30, 2025 Fourth Sunday of Lent – Laetare Sunday Readings: Joshua 5:9a,10-12; 2 Corinthians 5:17-21; Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

From Father's Desk -

Today is Laetare Sunday, which means it's the middle Sunday of the Lenten season. Laetare is a strong word for be glad, delight, be happy, be cheerful, or simply: rejoice! It's generally viewed as a stronger word than the one we celebrate during Advent, Gaudete. Here, there's a greater sense of joy because this deeper season of penance and sacrifice is half past, and the very event of our salvation is quickly approaching. We are allowed flowers, organ and instruments, and the priest can wear not purple but rose, to indicate a brighter and more beautiful day.

We have a few priests coming today to help us with our penance service. I hope to see all of you there. We will be overjoyed on this joyful Sunday if we have to stay not just one, but two or three hours to hear all the confessions of our parish families. What a witness and a grace that would be—for everyone to show up and all of us demonstrate how important, meaningful and lifegiving the Sacrament of Penance is. I know I am overwhelmed when I receive the sacrament, and humbled. I know how little I deserve it. But that's precisely why we go: our merciful Savior loves us and wants to bestow His peace in this very special way.

Each of us can give a powerful witness to our Catholic faith. By participating in all the sacramental life of the Church, we shore up in our own hearts the habit and importance of frequent participation. We also show others that the Catholic faith is essential to who we are—we set aside time for it when we could be doing something else. We rightly give the many prayers, devotions and sacraments of the Church a piece of our day—whether that's in coming to Mass, Confession, the Stations of the Cross, Adoration and Benediction, helping with Faith Formation, or any number of other things.

This is precisely what Bishop Barron is calling each of us to do. With the Synod on Evangelization and Vocations, he is asking us to make more room in our lives for the practice of and witness to our Catholic faith. And to do so unabashedly. Gladly tell others you believe the Eucharist is really Jesus' true Body and Blood—that's what Catholics believe. Gladly affirm that you can't eat meat on Fridays—that's what being Catholic means. Gladly tell others you confess your sins to a priest—that's what Catholics do. Gladly tell others you have to go to Stations before you can meet them for dinner—that is how Catholics pray and do penance! After all, this is precisely what Jesus tells us He wants us to do.

Bishop Barron speaks often of needing to shuffle off this attitude of "beige Catholicism", the idea that if we just kind of blend in and don't stick out, everything will be great. But it's precisely the opposite. We need to be distinctively Catholic so others can see the importance of living a different life, a life dedicated to Jesus in the Catholic Church.

Sacraments

<u>Baptism</u>. Arrangements for infant baptism are made at least one month in advance. A one-hour Pre-Jordan session is required for parents who have not participated in one previously. Baptism is preferably celebrated during the Mass on Saturday or Sunday. To make arrangements, contact Fr. Parrott.

<u>Marriage</u>: Arrangements for marriage should begin six months prior to the intended date of the wedding. Marriage preparation requires a series of meetings and a marriage encounter weekend. This sacrament is not celebrated during Lent or Holy Week.

<u>Confession</u>. This is offered before the Saturday Mass from 4:15 – 4:45 p.m., before or after daily Mass in the respective parishes or by appointment with Fr. Parrott or Fr. Collins (LeRoy, 507-289-7637).

St. Patrick: Wednesdays, 9 a.m. – 10 a.m.

St. Ignatius: *Thursdays, 9 a.m. – 7 p.m.*
